For dessert, there will be some kind of delectable Italian trifle (which, in an interesting quirk of fate, just happens to rhyme with rifle).

Packed with comedy, singing, dancing and acting, the show gives adults and children alike the chance to mix it up with the "Ba-Da-Bing" gang,, while enjoying the food. The fun centers around the Don's surprise party thrown by host Frankie Marone, who is attempting to get back into the Don's good graces by throwing the bash. And there's a "line-up" of characters attending the fete that you won't want to (and won't be able to) miss.

Showtime is 7:30 p.m.; doors open at 6 p.m. Guests can arrive early and enjoy a special "appetizer" to the show - free entertainment by professional artists that includes sing-alongs and other fun fare.
